MAORI CHANT — TERA IA

This traditional song was composed, initially, to pay the respects of the students to the tribe in whose territory they reside, to introduce themselves to tribes outside of Waikato and to teach the students something of the history of the Waikato people. A shorter version was first composed for the field trip into Tuhoe territory in the year 1976, but this particular version was composed in 1977 and was first publicly performed on the marae of Kai-a-te-mata, in the territory of Ngati Haua. The occasion was a field trip by the students. This is the waiata with which Te Whare Wananga o Waikato troupe won the traditional item section at the New Zealand Polynesian Festival held in Wellington in February 1979.

Yonder stands Taupiri mountain,
Located in the Waikato Basin
At the base of the Hunua Range.
I branch off to the marae of Tauranga nui, Te Awa-marahi and Nga Tai E Rua
I then head southwards to the territory of Te Pou o Mangatawhiri,
To Raungawari, original site of the house of Tane-i-te-pupuke,
And on to Horahora, Maurea and Rangiriri
Where the Kingitanga was fiercely contested
I now arrive at the marae of Hukanui, Te Ohaki, Kaitimu
And Waahi, residence of the paramount chieftainess.
I climb Taupiri, resting-place of the prestigious and the awesome,
And cast my glance eastwards to the territory of Ngati Haua
To the descendants of Tarapipipi residing at the marae of Kai-a-te-mata and Rukumoana
To the north of them are Marutuahu (Ngati Maru) and Ngati Paoa
And residing at the marae of Te Pai o Hauraki are Tama-te-ra
I trip over the hills to Maungatautari, to Kemureti,
To the wash-bowl of sorrow of my ancestor, Tawhiao.
At Orakau I weep for the noble blood of my ancestors, spilt here
Before speeding on to Pirongia, to Arekahanara,
The horn of strength of Tawhiao
I then soar on to the sea of Kawhia
To Kawhia of abundant food, to Kawhia of many people
To the place where the canoe Tainui is at rest.
Further south is Rotorua-nui-a-Kahu
And the tribe of Pikiaio,
From whom the male line of the Kingitanga traces its descent.
I, then, turn to the mountain of Tongariro
To the territory of Te Heuheu
To the lake of Taupo-nui-a-Tia,
The source of my river, Waikato.
I now retrace my journey to the territory of Ngati Hourua to Whatawhata,
I travel down the current of Waipa before entering into the charismatic waters of my
ancestors
About which it is said,
Waikato of a hundred monsters; at each bend a monster; at each bend a monster.
And so I make my landfall at Turangawaewae,
The most famous marae in the land.
This is Te Whare Wananga o Waikato paying its respects to you,
To my many rangatira, who are honouring us, the descendants of the area,
Of Tamaki in the north, Mokau in the south,
And Mangatoatoa, in the centre,
Aue! aue! aue! ha!
