A Brief History of the University of Waikato Te Whare Wānanga o Waikato

The University of Waikato had its genesis in 1956, when a small group of visionary individuals began working towards the founding of a university for the people of the South Auckland region. A college, or sub-branch of Auckland University, was established in 1959, and in 1964 the University of Waikato was officially opened by the then Governor-General, Sir Bernard Fergusson (later Lord Ballantrae).

Today the University of Waikato is a modern, forward-looking institution, with a powerful vision and commitment to being the New Zealand University for the 21st century. This is a far cry from its modest beginnings in 1964 on what was largely farmland, with a handful of temporary buildings and a few staff. The University now employs approximately 1700 academic and administrative staff. Around 3000 papers in 70 subject areas are taught to over 12,000 students annually. The campus covers some 68 hectares, with comprehensive on-site facilities to support the large University community including a range of student accommodation, banks, cafes, sports and recreation facilities, along with extensive teaching and research facilities.

The University region includes four of the major tribal confederations - Tainui, Te Arawa, Mataatua and Tairāwhiti. From its inception, the University has been at the forefront of initiatives for Māori, working closely with local iwi, particularly Tainui, to make the University accessible to Māori students. The University is proud to be the leading university in the development of partnerships with Māori, and to have the largest number and proportion of Māori students of any New Zealand university today.

Not all initiatives are campus-based. The offering of a range of first year papers in Tauranga in 1998 by the University, and the subsequent establishment of the University of Waikato at Tauranga, demonstrates the University's on-going commitment to meeting the needs of its regional community.

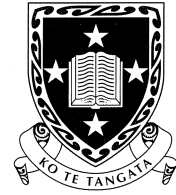
The University has developed a wide range of interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary degree programmes. A number of new degrees have been introduced since 1998 in recognition of the ever-increasing need for education and research in contemporary fields of knowledge.

The University of Waikato has a strong research programme and makes substantial contributions to the social and economic development of local, regional, national and international communities. The value of external research contracts in progress increased from \$1.6 million in 1986 to \$41 million in mid 1998. A 1998 assessment of the University's economic impact on the wider Waikato region was estimated at approximately \$500 million per annum.

The University of Waikato is a comparatively 'young' institution, functioning without the support of many generations of alumni and people with long-standing associations with the university. Despite its youth, the University of Waikato can look back with a good deal of satisfaction at its many remarkable accomplishments. It has begun the new century with confidence and optimism, secure in the knowledge that the University is well-placed to meet and shape future challenges.

The University Crest

The motto, Ko Te Tangata, means the People and reflects the University's philosophy that people are central to the institution and its most valued resource. The outside red border is a stylised fern frond or pitau that symbolises new birth, growth, vitality, strength and achievement. Inside the border is the University's coat of arms. The open book surrounded by the four stars of the Southern Cross is a symbol of learning. The crest design is in the University's colours of black, red and gold.

Chancellor

Mr John Gallagher CNZM, O.St.J, JP

As a business leader John Gallagher brings a wealth of business and community experience to the University Council. He is a shareholder and director of one of New Zealand's most successful export companies, the Gallagher Group. As an ardent supporter of growth and development in the community, John is actively involved with numerous community organisations including Habitat for Humanity, Rotary, St John's Ambulance and WEL Energy Trust. He served as the Deputy Mayor of Hamilton City from 1997 to 1998 and twelve years as a City Councillor. As a local body politician he has been instrumental in promoting and driving many of the city facilities and services. John was first elected to the University Council in 1990 as the representative of the Employers' Association. John is also a member of the Finance Committee and Deputy Chairman of the University of Waikato Foundation.



Pro Chancellor

Mrs Alison Annan DipT *Christchurch College of Education*, BA *Canterbury*, MPP *Victoria*

Alison is currently the Principal of Cambridge High School, a position to which she was appointed in 1992. Alison was the Founding Principal of Cambridge International College, is a Justice of the Peace, a Marriage Celebrant and an Associate Fellow of the New Zealand Institute of Management. Alison is very involved in international marketing, and Education Waikato.

She is married with four adult children.



Vice-Chancellor

Professor Bryan Gould BA LLM *Auckland* BCL MA *Oxford*

It has been a long and winding road for the Hawera-born Bryan Charles Gould; one that has led him from Auckland and Victoria Universities, through to Oxford University on a Rhodes Scholarship, then to the British Labour Party, Member of Parliament, director of the Labour general election campaign in 1987, and ultimately back to New Zealand, where he currently holds the position of Vice-Chancellor at the University of Waikato. After attending primary and secondary schools in Hawera, Palmerston North, Tauranga and Dannevirke, Professor Gould went on to take a double BA/LLB at Auckland and Victoria Universities, majoring in history for his Bachelor of Arts. In 1962 he took up a Rhodes Scholarship to Balliol College, Oxford, taking out his BCL(Oxon) *with First Class Honours* in 1964, and finally his MA in 1968. During this time he worked for the British Foreign Office, including some time as second secretary at the British Embassy in Brussels. Following a period as a Tutor and Fellow in Law at Worcester College, Oxford, Professor Gould entered politics in 1974, working for three years as the Parliamentary Private Secretary to the Rt. Hon. Peter Shore MP. A stint as a reporter and presenter on a Thames Television nationally networked current affairs show followed from 1979 to 1983, before entering politics again. This involved some ten years in the British Labour Party in various roles, including Shadow Trade and Industry Secretary, Shadow Environment Secretary and the Labour Party election campaign director for both the Euro-Elections in 1989 and General Elections in 1987 and 1992. Professor Gould has been the author of numerous publications, including *Socialism and Freedom, A Future for Socialism*, and the autobiographical *Goodbye to All That* in 1995. As a former university representative in various sports, Professor Gould retains an interest in tennis and swimming, as well as cooking, wine, gardening, music and New Zealand history.



Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research)

Professor Richard Bedford BA MA *Auckland* PhD *Australian National University, Canberra*

Professor Richard Bedford is currently Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research) at the University of Waikato where he has been Professor of Geography since 1989. In 2000 and 2001 he was Director of the University's satellite campus in Tauranga. He has undergraduate and graduate degrees from the University of Auckland and his PhD was completed in 1971 in the Research School of Pacific Studies at the Australian National University. He is a specialist in migration studies and since the mid-1960s has been researching processes of population movement in the Asia-Pacific region. During the 1980s Professor Bedford was the Convenor of the Population Monitoring Group of the former New Zealand Planning Council. He was awarded the NZ 1990 Medal for services to New Zealand. In 2000 he was elected to the Fellowship of the Royal Society of New Zealand. He is a member of the New Zealand National Commission for UNESCO, and Chair of the Commission's Social Sciences Sub-Commission. He is also the New Zealand Immigration Service's representative on an inter-governmental International Metropolis Project, and the Royal Society of New Zealand's contact point with the International Human Dimensions of Global Environmental Change Programme. In 2001 he was appointed by the Minister of Immigration as academic adviser to the Ministerial Advisory Group on Immigration.



Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic)

Professor Peggy G Koopman-Boyden CNZM MA DipEd Massey

The Dean of the School of Social Sciences since 1995, Professor Koopman-Boyden was appointed the Dean of Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences from 1999. Previously she was the CEO for the New Zealand Institute of Social Research and Development, and lectured at the University of Canterbury. She was also the co-founder and Director of the Southern Cross Language Institute in Christchurch. Professor Peggy Koopman-Boyden has undertaken sociological, demographic and policy research on ageing, and has chaired or has been a member of many national committees on social policy, family, women, the elderly and complementary and alternative health. These include the New Zealand Planning Council, National Council on HIV/AIDS, and the Gerontology Association. She is a Life Member of Age Concern (Canterbury) and was awarded a CNZM (Companion of the NZ Order of Merit) for services to the elderly.

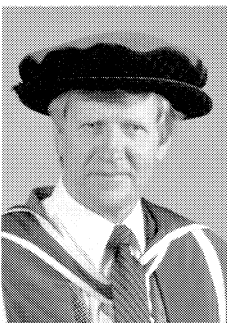


Director, University of Waikato at Tauranga

Associate Professor Alan Neilson was educated at Tauranga Boys' College, the University of Waikato and the University of York (England).

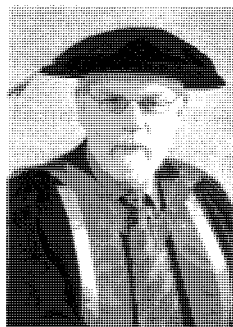

Acting Dean of Arts and Social Sciences

Dr Alan C Simpson BA BA(Hons) MA Wellington, PhD Waikato

Alan Simpson joined the University's Department of Politics in 1977, becoming Pro Dean of the then School of Social Sciences in 1996, and Associate Dean of the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences from 1998 to 2003. His main areas of research and publication are in International Relations, and New Zealand's electoral, public policy, political and constitutional developments.



Dean of Computing and Mathematical Sciences

Professor Mark Apperley BE PhD *Auckland* FNZCS

Mark Apperley began his academic career in electrical engineering, but after completing his PhD at Auckland University, and a period of post-doctoral research at Imperial College in London, he returned to New Zealand in 1975 to take up a lectureship in Computer Science at the University of Waikato. In 1985 he became Professor and Head of the Computer Science Department at Massey University. He returned to Waikato in 1994 as Chair of the department. Throughout his 30-year academic career, he has been very active in research in the area of human-computer interaction. He was appointed to the position of Dean of Computing and Mathematical Sciences in early 2003.



Principal and Dean of Education

Professor Noeline Alcorn BA *Victoria* MA *Canterbury* PhD *California* DipEd *Massey* DipT FNZEAS

Professor Noeline Alcorn taught in New Zealand secondary schools for some years before undertaking her doctoral study at the University of California. She held lecturing and management positions at Auckland Teachers' College and was the Director of the Centre for Continuing Education at the University of Auckland before taking up her current position as Principal and Dean at the School of Education. Professor Alcorn was Chairperson of the New Zealand Council for Educational Research from 1988 until 1993, and was awarded the Suffrage Medal in 1993. She is a Fellow of the New Zealand Educational Administration Society. Professor Alcorn has published widely in children's literature, school principalship and action research, and is currently researching educational administration, professional development and higher education policy. She recently completed a biography of C.E. Beeby. She is the inaugural chair of the Teacher Education of Forum Aotearoa New Zealand.



Dean of Law

Professor Scott Davidson BA MA *Cambridge*

Professor Scott Davidson graduated from the University of Cambridge in 1977 and has taught law in both the UK (University of Hull) and New Zealand (University of Canterbury). His main areas of interest are public international law and its sub-specialisms of the law of the sea and the international law of human rights.

Professor Davidson has authored and edited nine books and has written over fifty essays and articles which have been published in a variety of international journals. He is also on the editorial and advisory boards of the *International Journal of Marine and Coastal Law*, the *New Zealand Yearbook of International Law* and the *New Zealand Journal of Public and International Law*.

In 1992 Professor Davidson was awarded a Centennial Fellowship to study the provision of international legal advice to the governments of small island states. Professor Davidson has also been an occasional consultant to the New Zealand Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade and has represented New Zealand on the Maritime Cooperation Working Group of the Council for Security and Cooperation in Asia Pacific. Before becoming Dean of the Waikato Law School, Scott Davidson was Director of the University of Hull Law School in the UK.



Dean of Management

Professor Michael Pratt BA(Hons) *Sheffield* MCom *Witwatersrand* DCom *South Africa* ACA FCA

A specialist in the areas of performance, organization theory and auditing, Professor Michael Pratt joined the University of Waikato in 1990 as Dean of the Waikato Management School. He was previously Professor and Head of Department of Accounting at Massey University. With extensive industry experience, Professor Pratt is currently involved in researching peak performing organisations. He has published eight books and more than one hundred journal and conference papers. He advises the CEOs and top management teams of several leading global corporations in the USA and Europe on inspiration, peak performance, and value creation.

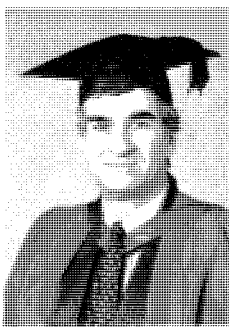


Acting Dean of Māori and Pacific Development

Associate Professor G R Aroha Yates-Smith BA MA PhD *Waikato* DipT *Hamilton Teachers' College*

He uri nō ngā iwi i heke mai ai i runga i waka o Te Arawa, o Tainui, o Takitimu, o Horouta.

Associate Professor Aroha Yates-Smith is the Acting Dean of Te Pua Wānanga ki te Ao, the School of Māori and Pacific Development. She completed her BA, MA, and PhD at the University of Waikato, and her Diploma of Teaching at the Hamilton Teachers' College. Aroha entered this University as a Junior Lecturer in 1986, after having taught Māori and German at Hillcrest High School. She held a Fulbright Scholarship at the University of Hawai'i, at Manoa in 1992 and in 1999 became the first PhD graduate from Te Pua Wānanga ki te Ao. Associate Professor Yates-Smith's research interests lie in the study of the feminine in Māori society and Māori spirituality.



Dean of Science and Technology

Professor Richard Price BSc (Hons) *Australian National University* PhD *Otago*

Professor Richard Price joined the University of Waikato in 1998 as the new Dean of the School of Science and Technology. Formerly an Associate Professor in Geology at La Trobe University, Professor Price gained his bachelors degree in geology from Australian National University, and was awarded his doctorate from Otago University in 1974. His major research interests include the application of trace element, major element and isotope geochemistry to geological problems throughout Australia, New Zealand and the Pacific. With a distinguished academic and publishing record to his credit, Professor Price is currently involved in a co-operative research project with academic colleagues from Auckland, Victoria and Massey Universities, studying the geology of Mounts Ruapehu and Taranaki.

Ceremonial Traditions

Elements of university graduation ceremonies have evolved from the 12th century when the first universities emerged in Europe. The organisation of medieval universities was modelled on the established institutions of the day – the church, the monastery, and the guild.

Latin was the language used by medieval scholars, and it is from Latin that the words 'university' and 'degree' are derived. The Latin term *universitas* means a guild or union and universities started as a scholastic guild – a self-constituted community of teachers and scholars.

The word graduate comes from the Latin word *gradus*, which means step. Admission to study a bachelors degree was the first step taken towards completing a university education. The second step was to become a 'master'. Masters were Master of Arts graduates whose degrees licensed them to teach.

The Chancellor, an officer of the cathedral, originally granted teaching licences.

Ceremonial Robes

In the Middle Ages the corporate existence of universities was recognised and sanctioned by civil or ecclesiastical authority. The regalia worn by graduates and university staff today reflect this mix of medieval governance. Robes worn by the Chancellor resemble those worn by the Lord Chancellor of England. Graduates and academic staff wear gowns similar to the dress of medieval clergy. Hoods are also fashioned on an everyday medieval garment, although the coloured lining was a later addition to indicate the wearer's university and degree.

University of Waikato Academic Dress

Academic regalia are as follows:

First Bachelors: Black gown; black hood with gold lining; black mortarboard.

Bachelors with Honours: Black gown; black hood with gold lining and gold border 5cm in width; black mortarboard.

Masters: Black gown; gold hood with gold lining; black mortarboard.

MPhil: Black gown; crimson hood with crimson lining; black mortarboard.

PhD: Maroon gown; crimson hood with crimson lining; black Tudor bonnet.

DLit, DSc: Crimson gown; crimson hood with crimson lining; black Tudor bonnet with gold cord and tassel.

HonD: Crimson gown; gold hood with gold lining; black Tudor bonnet with gold cord and tassel.

Chancellor and Vice-Chancellor: Black gown with lining of gold satin; gold button and cord just above the sleeves which are also lined with gold satin; a replica of the University's coat of arms just above the gold button on the shoulder; black Tudor bonnet with gold cord and tassel.

Pro Chancellor: Black gown with lining of gold satin; gold button and cord just above the sleeves which are lined with black satin; black Tudor bonnet with gold cord and tassel.

Assistant Vice-Chancellor: Black gown with lining of gold satin; gold button and cord just above the sleeves which are lined with black satin; a replica of the University's coat of arms just above the gold button on the shoulder; black Tudor bonnet with gold cord and tassel.

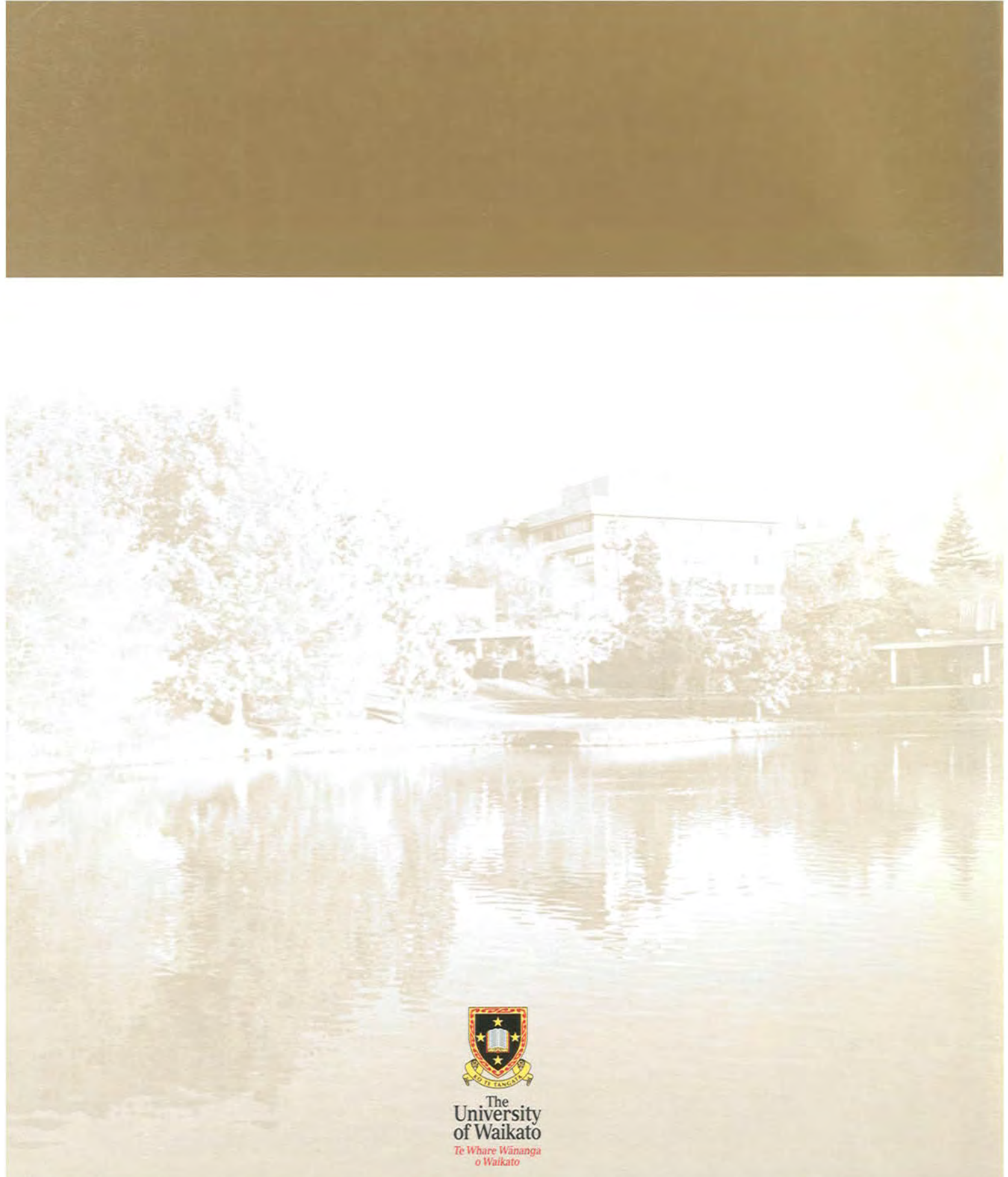
